This morning, the Senate Banking Committee held a hearing with Treasury Secretary Steven Mnuchin and Federal Reserve Chairman Jay Powell on their implementation of the CARES Act. At the hearing, Chairman Powell announced that the Fed is working to launch the Main Street Lending Program by the end of this month. And ahead of the hearing, the NAM made sure manufacturers' concerns with the Paycheck Protection Program and the Fed's liquidity facilities were officially entered into the [record](#). We will continue raising your concerns directly with lawmakers and administration officials, as we have throughout this crisis.

### **Workforce Policy Advisory Board Meeting**

Today, I joined Advisor to the President Ivanka Trump and the American Workforce Policy Advisory Board for our first meeting since our previously scheduled meeting in March was canceled. We discussed the ever-increasing importance of access to skills training, especially in the wake of the pandemic. I emphasized that to ensure a strong economic recovery, incentives for workforce development and skills training are more important than ever. Programs that focus on earn-and-learn models, or apprenticeships, should be prioritized, as well as partnerships between companies and local educational institutions so that we have the skilled workers ready to operate in new environments and to fill new jobs created by shifts in supply chains.
